1. The President reported the expenditures for the first three months of the fiscal year ended September 30, 1926:

4. Upon the recommendation of the Director of the Extension, IT WAS VOTED: that a special allotment of funds be made for the six months period, January 1st, 1927 to June 30th, 1927:

5. Upon recommendation of the Director of the Extension Division, IT WAS VOTED: that the emergency funds provided by Chap. 240 of the Public Acts of 1925 be alloted as follows:

Fairfield County\$500.
Litchfield County1000.
Middlesex County1000.
Ew London County500.

6. The President reported the expense for livestock exhibit at the Charter Oaks Fair was \$538.14. The premiums awarded but not as yet paid amounted to \$436.00.

The expense of the exhibit at the State Building was \$216.33.

7. Upon the recommendation of Director W. L. Slate, IT WAS VOTED: to petition the State Board of Finance to recommend to the State Board of Control for permission to increase the salary of Miss Marjorie W. Smith, Secretary to the Director of the Experiment Station, from \$1400 to \$1500 per year to begin October 1st, 1926.

8. The President reported that he had solicited an opinion from Mr. Buckley as to the possibility of arranging with the heirs and residuary legatees for an exchange of the property left to the College by Edwin Gilbert for another part of the residuary fund or estate.

The receipts and expenditures of Gilbert Farm for a period of 21 years is as follows:

- 9. The President reported that the contract for the new church had been let to Peck-McWilliams Company of Morwich.
- 10. In response to a letter from the President to Stanley H. Osborn, soliciting an opinion in relation to Student Health, the Commissioner states:
 - (a) There should be at the College an infirmary for the detention of suspicious communicable disease cases and quarters for the treatment of such cases.
 - (b) The College should not depend upon the State Department of Health for physical examination of incoming men and women.
 - (c) Parents should be informed of defects revealed in physical examination, and a check or follow-up should be carried out at least twice during the year.
 - (d) The College should employ a resident physician.
- 11. IT WAS VOTED: to approve of the request of J. A. Simms, Extension Animal Husbandman, for a leave of absence with salary from January 5rd, 1927 to June 18th, 1927, for the purpose of professional improvement.
- 12. On the petition of the County Extension Agents Association, IT WAS VOTED: to approve of the request that the Director of the Extension Service use his good offices to secure one month amoual leave with full pay for all county extension workers, to become effective in 1927.
- 13. IT WAS VOTED: to appoint the Prosident of the College, the Director of Extension and the Director of the Experiment Station as delegates to the annual meeting of the Association of Land Grant Colleges to be held in Washington, Nov. 13 16.
